In these services, we have something to suit all ages. During the first part of the service we have all age worship where everyone joins together exploring the theme of that particular service. This is done through such things as singing, prayers and a talk. There is a small area on the left hand side of the church for pre-walking babies, with soft mats and toys. A visual

to come along as helpers. The events include games, crafts, stories and other fun activities.



About Us Location

Viewfield Baptist Church is located near the town centre of Dunfermline and is easily accessible by car or bus. In addition to the main, multi-purpose sanctuary, we have a large hall, a range of

smaller rooms in the "Viewfield Centre" next door to the main church building, and also "The Garage" (primarily our youth room) entered from the Church car park. There is a council car park situated on Viewfield Terrace, opposite the Viewfield Centre, which is free on Sunday mornings. The small church car park (between the two buildings) is reserved for people with mobility difficulties, who can enter the building from the car park, and access the Sanctuary via a lift. The church is also within a 10 minute walk of Dunfermline Town Train Station (although be prepared for the hill should you choose this method!) and Dunfermline Bus Station. Our main doors to the church building

are situated on East Port.

"Oasis" is open 12noon-3pm on Tuesdays, in the Viewfield Centre, providing a place where people who are vulnerable or isolated can come to find people who will listen to them, befriend and



offer relationship with them. Food and refreshment are offered in



a welcoming environment. This is a safe place where advice, or direction to where to find it, is also available. Where the isolated are welcome, to where they can belong.

Open Church The Sanctuary is open on a Friday morning from 10am until 12noon. Anyone who would value a place of guiet and/or a chat, with tea and coffee available, will be welcome.

Knit & Natter is a friendly group of people that meets in the Church Hall at 10am each Wednesday. There is the opportunity to chat to each other while knitting. We can provide yarn, needles and patterns and help to get you started to knit or crochet or if you want to just natter that is fine too. Everyone is welcome.

Praise Fitness takes place in the Church Hall on a Saturday at 9.30am and on a Wednesday at 12 noon. Have fun and get fit whilst listening to praise music! The Wednesday session is geared towards exercising whilst being seated. Wear comfortable clothes and trainers, and bring a bottle of water.

What's On Sundays

During the service, some groups leave to give an opportunity to explore the Bible in a way that suits them.

Children's Church takes place every Sunday

(except when there are All Age Services) and caters for ages 2-12(S1). After participating in the start of the 10.30am service, we go down to the hall for activities, beginning all together, then splitting into four age groups. Activities include games, stories, quizzes, songs, videos, drama etc. all based around the theme or Bible Story for each week. We use the Scripture Union material which covers the core themes and passages of the Old and New Testament in a three year cycle.

Connected is our Sunday morning group for young people aged 13(S2) to 18. They meet most weeks at the same time as

> Children's Church, for discussion and Bible exploration. Sometimes they remain in the main service giving an opportunity to learn and contribute.

The Crèche runs during every Sunday morning service and caters for children under the age of 2. The group normally starts when the children leave for Children's Church but if required, can start earlier.



As a growing church, with new and developing ministries, an increasing staff team, and buildings to maintain, we trust God for the provision of the financial resources which are needed to enable our

work and ministries.

About 85% of our income is provided by donations from within the Viewfield Family.

As we continue to develop our ministries, and follow God's leading to share his love with our community, we will need

Funds: The General Fund is used for all of our ongoing income and expenditure for Viewfield Ministries.

Specific Funds are used to channel donations to external causes such as our Harvest and Christmas offerings.

The **Project Fund** is used to raise funds for major projects (including seeking grants). Currently we are raising funds to install Soft Play and a Sensory Room and establish a Café in the Church Hall, and also to upgrade our AV/IT equipment

World Mission



Vision Romania works with Christian partners in and around the city of Hunedoara to deliver a programme of

support to underprivileged young people and

people with disabilities. In addition to weekly Good News groups taking place in the rural outskirts of the city, children from an orphanage are taken out for trips and treats. The Charity supports a local initiative working with children with Autism and also enables a monthly food drop to a small community of around 20 families living in shacks which lack even basic amenities. Vision Romania teams from Scotland work with Romanian partners to deliver two week long residential respite camps every year: one for young adults with disabilities and the other for children. The charity organises a shoe box appeal with around 2000 boxes per annum being sent to young people for Christmas.

Africa Inland Mission (AIM) is an organisation which aims at reaching the unreached people groups in Africa. Georgette Short has been serving with

them for over 10 years, firstly in Kenya and now at Tilsley College in Motherwell.

How to give

If you pay UK tax, please consider signing a Gift Aid Declaration. This allows us to claim back the tax which you have already paid on your donations, and in so doing, increases the value of your donation by 25%.



Options for giving by Gift Aid:

- set up a standing order
- make payments by BACS
- use weekly or monthly offering envelopes and place them in the donations box in the Sanctuary.

By using a reference number, your donations will be confidential, with only the Treasurer needing to know how much you are giving (in order to keep appropriate records).

• If you prefer to give anonymously, you can set up an account with CAF (cafonline.org) or Stewardship Services (stewardship.org.uk) who will claim the Gift Aid, then pass on your donations (anonymously if you wish) to Viewfield or any charities of your choice.

If you do not pay tax, you may still give by any of the above options, or you can put cash straight into the donations box.
