### Ukraine Refugees – Vision Romania



Maria Putator in Romania, who owns and operates Casa Harului, where the Vision Romania respite camps take place has re-opened to take in Ukrainian families.

Here is an update from Maria at Casa Harului on her work with the Ukrainians who have taken refuge at the camp.

"Ana, from Micoalev, mother of Nicolae (2), Victoria (9) arrived at Casa Harului several weeks ago. When she packed her two bags, she said "God, if you exist, take me and the children into a safe place". She got to Kishinev, dragging two children and two bags on a street, when a woman approached her saying: "if you need help, there is a Church who can help you." Pastor Alexandru spoke to her, gave her the address of Casa Harului. Stepping in another unknown wasn't easy for her. Before people leave Ukraine, they are told, that over the border no one is going to help. She was overwhelmed by hospitality and care. She never knew God in such a way that she is seeing now, and she would like to be more like us. Ana is so close to receiving Christ.

Today, a friend from Belgium visited us for couple of hours, he brought Ukrainian New Testaments. Only God can arrange all these details.

We are overwhelmed by God's goodness.

As families begin to open their heart to God, the need of Ukrainian Bibles is great. Again God took us by surprise... he sent Ismail, from Belgium, with 10 New Testaments! Just a couple of hours visit!!

Then in the evening a small group of girls from Hunedoara, came to do craft with the kids, brought some gifts from church kids, inside there was a leaflet in Ukraine (why God lets people suffer, what is the purpose for my life, etc?).

And, at 10pm, a car with a trailer on, turned up, packed with aid, from Austria.

We serve Almighty God!"
